#### 2023 – Crime Severity Index




#### CSI Values

The Airdrie Municipal Detachment's 2023 CSI value is 46.6. This is an increase of 0.6% when compared to the newly revised 2022 CSI value of 46.3.

The overall CSI in Alberta for 2023 was 103.0, a 2% decrease when compared to 2022.

The chart to the right shows the CSI values for the Airdrie Municipal Detachment from 2015 to 2023.

In 2023 Fraud Offences accounted for 17.3% of the Airdrie Municipal Detachment's CSI.

The top ten CSI contributors, listed in the table to the left accounted for a combined total of 79.9% of the Airdrie Municipal Detachment's CSI.

The largest driver to the increase in CSI from 2022 to 2023 was an increase in Break & Enter offences. There were 62 more in 2023 than in 2022. This caused a CSI increase of 2.5 points.

The top 3 drivers to the increase in CSI, as well as the top 2 decreases can be found in the tables below.

### 2024 January - June Airdrie Municipal Crime Gauge











### Mental Health Liaison Team (MHALT)

- Engagement with Alberta Health Services liaising to identify clients' best mental health treatment options
- Working with Community Links with their services offered, engaging with their clients bringing them to the proper facilities deemed necessary
- Working with Calgary hospitals to place clients into the correct detox treatment facilities, for long term success
- Working with Shelters to house clients safely & referral for treatment/support. This eliminates the root issue and allows for long term treatment.





### Crime Reduction Unit (CRU)

- Assisted with/recommended charges/charged: 35 files
- Drugs seized/property recovered: approx. \$63,000
- Judicial Authorizations Authorized: 23
- CRU located a stolen vehicle at a gas station. The driver fled and members engaged in a foot pursuit. The suspect was apprehended and was discovered to have been released from Remand less than 24 hrs prior. In addition to the stolen vehicle, the suspect was found in possession of 2 garage door openers, stolen property and drug paraphernalia.
- Using covert tactics, CRU assisted in locating/identifying a suspect vehicle in a discharge firearm with intent file.
- CRU continues to show how invaluable they are with the constant support they
  provide to multiple Units within the detachment. They are often pulled from their
  own priorities/projects to assist with intelligence gathering and covert surveillance.





## General Investigations Section (GIS)

- GIS has assisted in 25 investigations between April and June. This comes in the form of interviews, judicial authorizations and surveillance. Along with assisting multiple Units within the detachment.
- GIS was the primary unit on 20 investigations, one was a shooting in the City that hit multiple residences and another was a sexual assault on a minor .
- They assisted with surveillance, successfully laying a spike belt and the recovery of a stolen vehicle. The suspect was found to be in possession of a weapon.





# Specialized Investigation Unit (SIU)

- Investigated a Conspiracy to Commit Murder file that is domestic violence related and laid charges on a high profile sexual interference/child pornography file.
- Assisted GIS in several complex investigations where 17+ Judicial Authorizations were authorized.
- All three Plain Clothes Units assisted General Duty members and Provincial Units in a high risk, domestic violence related member involved shooting.
